## Fast Facts About Bunge in the U.S.

- The mill in Crete, Nebraska, was established in 1869 and holds the record for the oldest business in Crete. It's older than the railroad—and the town itself!
- The company purchased its first sizable grain facility in Midway, Minnesota, in 1935.
- Bunge's facility in Council Bluffs, Iowa, is the largest North American single-line, standalone crusher refiner.
- Morristown, Indiana, was the first facility in the world to use enzymatic degumming to refine soybean oil.
- Bunge opened the Creative Solutions Center in St. Charles, Missouri, in 2017.
- Bunge moved its global headquarters to St. Louis, Missouri, in 2019.
- Bunge acquired the state-of-the-art oil refinery in Avondale, Louisiana, in 2023.
